

Randy Meyer was named Sweet Home ISD Superintendent/Principal on August 6, 2007. He is coming to Sweet Home after 14 years of service to students in public education.

Randy began his service in public education as the Safe and Drug Free Schools Coordinator with Gonzales ISD. He coordinated a program that served all 2600 GISD students in grades K-12. In the fall of 1996, Randy moved to the classroom at North Avenue Elementary in Gonzales as a 5<sup>th</sup> grade teacher. He taught Language Arts, Science, and Social Studies. In January 2000, Randy was named Assistant Principal of the new Gonzales Elementary School. This brand new campus reorganized 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, and 4<sup>th</sup> graders on the same campus. The new campus in Gonzales hosted 560 students, 45 teachers, and 30 additional support staff. In 2002, Randy accepted a principal's position at Leonard Shanklin Elementary with Luling ISD. The Luling elementary campus welcomed Randy's positive energy and innovative ideas to lead the campus into the age of TAKS after 11 years of TAAS. After two years as principal at this elementary campus, the school district named Randy as principal of Luling Junior High school. Again, Randy served his students and faculty as an instructional leader dedicated to insuring the success of every student. In 2005, Randy returned to Gonzales Elementary as the campus principal.

Randy is originally from Austin and graduated from Crockett High School in south Austin. He is a graduate of Southwest Texas State University (Texas State).

Randy's wife is a first grade teacher with Gonzales ISD. Dolly is from Belmont, Texas. They have 3 children, Trevor 7, Austin 5, and Madison 2. The family is excited about being a part of the Sweet Home ISD family.
