A motion was made by Ms. Bludau to have a committee meet outside the meeting to discuss those changes and issues. The committee would consist of the Superintendent, the PTO secretary, and one teacher. The motion was seconded by Juliet Monk. All approved and the motion carried.

Also under old business, Pres. Chumchal reported that there was a mistake in ordering the cookbooks and they would not be available until the spring. They would be used to raise funds throughout the spring and kept to be sold throughout next year.

Under new business, the chili supper committees made their reports on progress. The raffle tickets were proofread and would be printed for distribution before the Christmas break. Christine Brown asked for any volunteers to help out with the tickets. Lolly Mican reported she had secured an auctioneer and the auction is picking up their donated items. Ms. Bludau reported that the Rupperts volunteered to provide sound equipment for the hall on the night of the supper. Terry Hermes reported that the cooking committee was ready and the Boswell family would donate the meat that is usually ordered instead of ordering and purchasing it. The meal tickets are printed for the banks and they would be distributed on Thursday as well as the
