

Sweet Home Parents and Teachers Organization (P.T.O.)

January 13, 2003

President Dr. Neil Campbell called the meeting to order at 6:05 PM in the school cafeteria. There were a total of 18 persons who signed in at this meeting.

A motion was made by Christie Talbert to accept the P.T.O. minutes of the December 16, 2003 meeting as read with the correction of Mr. Campbell was late replacing later. Missy McCord seconded the motion. All approved so the motion carried.

The Treasurer Beth Campbell read the treasurers report and stated that there were some deposits made from raffle ticket sales, but there would need to be some money moved from the money market account to the regular checking account to cover some expenses from the upcoming Chili Supper. The regular checking account was shown to have a balance of \$ 2,183.52. The money market was shown to have a balance of \$ 13,377.28. A motion was made by Lolly Mican to accept the treasurer's report. Ms. Raz seconded the motion. All approved so the motion carried.

A motion was made by Lolly Mican to open the agenda to add old business items and it was seconded by Missy McCord. The item of Concession Stand guidelines was added.

Under old business, all the standing chili supper committees reported. Christine Brown was absent so there was no report on the raffle. Lolly Mican reported there would be a note going home in the Thursday folder for auction donations. There was discussion about an ad that was placed in the Yoakum Herald-Times regarding the donations local businesses were making and the support they expected from the local community. It was suggested that the PTO should also place an ad after the Chili Supper acknowledging all of their supporters. Ms. Mican suggested next year the raffle and the auction may want to work together to ensure that all donations were placed accordingly. The games committee reported there would be no live fish offered, but rather a coupon would be given instead. Mr. Shimek has volunteered to sell the game tickets all night. There was discussion of not opening the bar at the supper, but it was decided to have the bar open as a service even though there may not be much profit. Ms. Chumchal reported that the

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flyers were all over town, and there were also radio announcements, and the TCI channel would run an advertisement. The correspondence committee is sending out thank you notes as they arrive. The sound equipment and the child patrol are all covered.

Also under old business, Pres. Campbell stated that he would write a list of concession stand etiquette to be used at all games or concession stands held. He wanted to clarify the wording that he would use would include, “concession stand items should be paid for or placed on a tab to be paid.” There was no further discussion.

The superintendent report was given by Mrs. Bludau. She reminded the members of the upcoming basketball game and the campus advisory meeting. She also stated there would be no school on Monday the 21st due to an inservice to help align the current curriculum with the local high school curriculum. Ms. Bludau also reported on the telephone system at the school that needs to be upgraded, available email accounts, a personal matter with the faculty, and available yearbooks.

Under new business, there will be a concession stand offered at the February 20th UIL meet. Ms. Kristek said she would be in charge of the stand and would organize personal pan pizzas from Pizza Hut as had been done in the past.

A suggestion was made to send a personal card to Mr. and Mrs. Aikens from the Sweet Home PTO. Tiffany Johnson stated she would send a card.

A drawing for the attendance prize for the meeting was drawn and went to Denise Raz’s class.

The next P.T.O. meeting will be held on Tuesday, February 10th, 2004.

A motion was made by Mr. Beard to adjourn the meeting. Missy McCord seconded the motion. All approved so the motion carried.
